

## Car Park Reconfigurations at Nevill Hall Hospital as Preparations Begin for New Radiotherapy Unit

With Welsh Government approval of the new proposed Satellite Radiotherapy Unit expected by the end of this year, this sees the start of a very exciting time for Nevill Hall Hospital and for Aneurin Bevan University Health Board. Following approval, the new £45 million Centre of Excellence for Cancer will be located on the site of Nevill Hall Hospital's former Ante-Natal Unit, with completion expected within approximately two years.

As is to be expected, there are some preparatory works required before construction commences, which will mean some essential temporary changes to the provision of car parking and the management of traffic through the Nevill Hall site from Saturday 19th November 2022.

The key proposed changes will be undertaken in two phases; phase 1- pre-construction, and phase 2- construction.

### Phase 1 - Pre-Construction - Saturday 19th and Sunday 20th November

Work to create additional car parking spaces in the hospital's main carpark will take place over the weekend of the 19th & 20th November, as outlined below, meaning that some car parking spaces will be temporarily unavailable whilst this work is ongoing over the weekend.

We would be extremely grateful if, during this time, our patients and visitors could consider alternative ways of arriving at the hospital, such as travelling by bus, being dropped off by a loved one, or lift-sharing. We would also ask that patients leave plenty of time to arrive at their appointment in case of traffic delays through the site.

We apologise for the inconvenience these unavoidable works will cause for our staff, patients and visitors, but this temporary disruption will result in a fantastic new facility to serve the population of Gwent.
